## Lattice Cushions



Start with a small piece of fondant that you make into the shape of an egg.

I recommend marking the diamond lines before you start piping.

This is very useful so as to get straight lines. With the tip #2 pipe the first layer, piping once in both directions. At this time you will need to create a stable base before

adding the rest of the layers. Repeat one more time with the same tip #2 in both directions. You will need to let this set 10 minutes before adding more layers.





With the tip #1.5 add two more layers and let set for 10 minutes before adding two more layers in both directions.

With the tip Wilton #1 add two more a layers and let it set for 10 minutes before adding the last two layers. To achieve a more delicate cushion, you may wish to finish by over piping with an even smaller tip,



such as a PME 0.

To embellish add a gumpaste daisy (small size using the PME plunger. Pipe a dot of royal icing and attach the daisy all around the cushion to cover the seams.



To enhance the border we will create a 3D layered stringwork . Pipe a string with the tip #4 right underneath of the cushion. Let it set. Underneath this fist row pipe with a tip #3. Repeat this process with the tips #2 and #1. Let it set for 10 minutes.

Now we will create the layered work.

Pipe the first row of stringwork with the tip #4 (4) times. The second layer tip #3 (3)

The third layer tip #2 (2). And lastly a layer of piped dots.
