

Mr. and Mrs. Starfish by: Jennifer Dontz



1. Left – You can use any starfish mold. But of course, if you want to place them in the chairs like I did, make sure they will fit in the seat. I used white chocolate in the mold but you can use fondant or gumpaste as well. If you use paste, let it dry before proceeding.
2. Right – I dry brushed the chocolate starfishes with super pearl luster dust to give them some shimmer.



3. Left – Depending on the size of your starfish, kind of eye up or measure how large you want the brim of the hat then find a small circle cutter or tip that will allow you to get that size. Roll out your paste, leaving a little thick and cut with the cutter.
4. Right – Cut a pretty good size hole out of the middle of the brim. You want it to be large enough so the “arm” of the starfish can fit up into it.



5. Left – Make kind of cylinder of paste for the top part of the hat. How tall or wide you make this kind of depends on your own opinion. Roll it and place it on top of the brim you made and see if you like the proportions.
6. Right – Make a hole in one end, again to allow the “arm” of the starfish to go up into it a bit. I used a cel stick. Make it about as wide as the hole in the brim.



7. Left – Brush some gumglue on the rim of the top piece and glue the two pieces together.
8. Right – Press together to adhere the top to the bottom piece. Now you have a finished hat.



9. Left – Ok, he's done 😊 I glued the hat with a spot of chocolate.
10. Right – Now let's finish her. You are going to have to guess how big of a circle to cut for the veil. I used white tulle which can be purchased at a material supply shop. If you fold the paper in half and hold it over the starfish, you should be able to see if you need larger or smaller. I made a paper template to cut around.



11. Fold the cut tulle in half to make a half circle shape.



12 – Above – I hot glued a bow to the middle of the straight edge of the tulle. With a spot of chocolate, I glued it to the top of one of the arms.



There they are on top of the cake, Mr. and Mrs. Starfish. My bride did bring me a picture to reference and I wish I knew who originally created them. I surely would give credit.
