
HOW DO THEY DO THAT??

This month's tutorial is by my very good friends, Mar Herbet and Becky Guidry. When the ladies were up I teaching a class this past spring, they allowed me to photograph their method of making rope borders. Be this is the EASIEST method I've ever seen. They ma comment to me, once you see this, you'll never make ropes any other way. They were right :-) You can meast three different widths of rope from the same Fir Impression mold.

1 - Make a long worm with your paste. Any paste v fondant, gumpaste or pearl clay are good choices. P I use pearl clay whenever possible. It's almost all ch and soooo good. Place worm in the mold. If you wa thicker rope, make a thicker worm.



2 - Squeeze the mold together working down the ent of the mold.



3 - Pop the rope out on the table. How easy is that?





4 - If you happen to put to much paste into the mold get a "seam" just take a pair of scissors and trim the



5 - Cut the rope at an angle shown, so you can piece to end and not be able to tell where they piece.





6 - Martha produced these three sizes of ropes in a n few minutes, using ONE mold.



7 - When put together, you really can't see a seam.
